

IMPORTANT INFORMATIONS FOR AUTHORS

The Journal of Clinical Sexology (JCS) is edited quarterly by the Romanian Society of Clinical Sexology and Human Procreation.

The Journal of Clinical Sexology is a high quality peer-reviewed scientific journal, where original research papers concerning medical disciplines such as Obstetrics and Gynecology, Urology, Dermato-venerology are being published ; furthermore, apart from the beforementioned medical areas of study, there is also a great number of other disciplines that have a notable impact concerning the Journal: Psychology, Criminology, particular aspects concerning the Judicial system and certain religious notions.

The Journal is issued with the main objective of properly informing its readers about medical notions – in a comprehensible and clear manner.

Instructions for Authors

Accepted types of paper

JCS publishes original research papers contributing to the improvement of information in this area.

Each and every Journal edition remains open to new contributions, meaning that there is no imposed or specific set of themes for a particular Journal number.

More precisely, the Journal is issued in a standard, IMRAD form – with the scientific value of its encompassed articles being

validated by the significance and applicability asserted within the published editorials.

Publication fee (APC)

A processing charge of 50 EUR will have to be paid for articles accepted for scientific evaluation by the editorial board of the Journal of Clinical Sexology. Please note that the payment will only be required if your article and application pass the Technical check and is accepted for scientific evaluation (the article is “under Review”). The Journal does not have article submission charges.

The publication fee for the accepted article is 150 EUR (or equivalent to RON for Romanian citizens), which have to be paid when article proof is sent to the correspondence author.

The authors will support the cost of English supervision (if the manuscript needs assistance). **If reasonable corrections are required the charge is 20 EUR (or equivalent in RON for Romanian citizens)/ revised page.**

Language

Please write your text in good English (American or British usage is accepted, but not a mixture of these).

Submission

Submission to this journal proceeds totally online. The main text is required in DOC file (Word 97-2000) with the tables included.

The figures are required to be inserted with captions at the end of the manuscript (JPEG/ TIFF) with high resolution.

The submitted paper will be transformed in PDF in order to be reviewed.

When submitting the manuscript, is mandatory to include, as first page, a cover letter to the editor. The cover letter must state that:

- all the authors approved that the paper to be submitted to JCS;
- the article is original and is the work of the authors;
- the novelty or the significance of results.

All correspondence, including notification of the Editor's decision and requests for revision, will be done by e-mail.

PREPARATION of Manuscript

*.DOC file for the manuscript is required.

This should have the tables included, and the figures must be inserted with captions, after the References, on separate pages.

JCS Standard Page is B5 (ISO): 176 x 250 mm (6.929 x 9.843 inch), margins of 2 cm (0.8 inch). Use paragraph spacing of 1.5 lines.

Please use as fonts only: Times New Roman or Arial.

First page must be the cover letter.

ARTICLE STRUCTURE

Divide your article into clearly defined sections. Each heading should appear on its own separate line.

The order is: Title, Authors, Affiliation, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Experimental (Materials and Methods), Results and Discussions, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, References, Appendices and Funding Body.

All text should be font size 10.

Title

Concise and informative. Avoid abbreviations and formulae where possible.

Font: all caps bold, size 12.

Authors

Please write full names; family name will be written in CAPS.

One Author must be clearly indicated as corresponding author (* as footnote on first page) and it is compulsory to indicate e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers with country and area code. Font size 10.

Affiliation

Present the authors' affiliation addresses (where the actual work was done) below the names. Indicate all affiliations with a lower-case superscript number immediately after the author's name and in front of the appropriate address.

Provide the full postal address of each affiliation, including the country name, and, if available, the e-mail address of each author. Font size 8.

Abstract

A concise and factual abstract is required.

The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions. Use no more than 200 words.

The Abstract title: font bold italic, size 8; the abstract text – font italic, size 8.

Keywords

Provide a maximum of 8 keywords, avoid general and plural terms and use only abbreviations firmly established in the field.

These keywords will be used for indexing purposes. The Keywords title: font bold italic, size 8; the keywords – font italic, size 8.

Introduction

State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background.

Experimental (or Materials and Methods)

The experimental methods should be described after the introductory material.

Detailed experimental descriptions should be restricted to one section of the paper.

Sufficient detail should be given to allow any experienced worker to implement the procedures described. Procedural steps should not be numbered.

Results and Discussions

Results should be clear and concise.

This should explore the significance of the result of the work, not repeat them.

Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature.

Conclusions

This should include key findings of the research, quantitative analytical performance figures (if appropriate) and their significance to real sample matrices.

Ethics and Rights**Duplicate Publication**

It is unethical for authors to submit multiple similar manuscripts for publication at a time.

It is also unethical for authors to submit a manuscript that has already been published or is in the process of review elsewhere.

Reproducibility, Plagiarism and Falsification

Authors must report their work accurately and precisely in order to be reproduced by other researchers independently.

Plagiarism and falsification in any parts of the submitted paper are serious offences to the scientific community and must strictly be avoided.

Authorship

The co-authors should be limited to those who have sufficiently contributed to the content of the work in responsible and accountable manners.

The corresponding author must confirm that submission of the manuscript has been approved by all coauthors.

Copyright

JCS it is an open access journal. All content is freely available without charge to any user or his/her institution.

Users are allowed to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of the articles in this journal without asking prior permission from the publisher or the author.

The only requirement is that the work or the author be referred to in your research as a bibliographic source.

Conflict of Interests

Journal of Clinical Sexology requires that each author, reviewer, and editor must disclose to the editor-in-chief any conflict of interest related to family, personal, financial, political or religious issues as well as any competing interest.

Whether or not a conflict of interest and financial support exist, they must be declared at the ICMJE Conflict of Interest form as well as at the end of the manuscripts.

If a reviewer, an associate editor, or a section editor has a conflict of interest and/ or believes that it is not appropriate to be a reviewer, or an editor for a given manuscript, the reviewer or the editor should resign from the assignment.
